

FOUNDER'S MESSAGE

Hello fellow dog lover,

Every year the ranch grows and every year we save more lives because of your incredible support. In fact we have now rescued more than 41,000 dogs and united countless families with their new forever friends.

With our growth we have become a global voice for the protection and proper treatment of dogs. Media coverage of our rescue of Miracle, the dog trapped beneath hurricane debris in the Bahamas, allowed us to spread the word that the Bahamas animals were in desperate need of help to millions of TV, magazine, newspaper and internet viewers around the globe.

From the Oval office in the White House I participated in a Presidential signing of the first U.S. law that makes animal abuse a federal crime. While there I personally asked the President to help us end the horrible China meat trade, an industry which commits untold atrocities each day.

In fact Big Dog Ranch Rescue sends teams to China on a regular basis to bring back precious lives that had been earmarked for slaughter houses. Our system of photographing dogs and creating their biographies in Asia prior to flying them here means that many are already adopted prior to their arrival. In addition, many breeds not readily available from the states find loving homes with families who have made specific requests.


As you can imagine this important work highlighting global animal abuse as well as deployment of rescue teams to disaster areas to feed family pets and rescue endangered shelter dogs comes at a cost. 





BIG DOGS VALENTINE'S **NIGHT OUT**


FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 14, 2019

FRIDAY, DECEMBER 6, 2019



Saving a precious, loving, dog's life is priceless. But there are many expenses involved, including:


- Transportation and all costs associated (gas, transporters, staff)
- Temporary quarantine boarding for out-of-state emergency rescues
- Intake exam
- Treatment of heartworm-positive dogs (90-day treatment plan and medicine)
- Medicine and supplies for other medical conditions

- Spay/neuter surgery and after care
- Specialty surgeries when necessary
- Staffing (1 person for every 12-15 dogs) well beyond the industry standard
- Facility and operational costs including utilities, insurance, and maintenance
- Caring for the dog while he or she waits for a forever home

CAMPUS AMENITIES

Big Dog Ranch Rescue is a 33-acre property evolving as the nation's premiere cage-free rescue facility. The campus and our programs are designed to encourage active, high-touch engagement with humans and other dogs. Our campus plays a pivotal role in successful adoption transitions. The Big Dog Ranch Rescue environment teaches dogs how to thrive in homes.

HEALTHY IS HAPPY

Big Dog Ranch Rescue guests begin their stays with comprehensive medical and dental evaluations, followed by appropriate treatment and therapy. A healthy dog is a happy dog - and a happy dog is a welcome pet.

We have world-class veterinarians, caregivers, and staff

State-of-the-Art Intake/Quarantine Facilities where potentially sick dogs are quarantined to eliminate any chance of cross-contamination with healthy dogs. They receive basic wellness care and vaccinations and are prepared for spay/neuter/microchip before moving to one of 90 12x12 cage-free bunk rooms.

Gold-standard Veterinary Healing Center provides routine and life-saving services to injured and ill dogs. At Big Dog Ranch Rescue, we spay/neuter, vaccinate, microchip, groom, and treat any medical conditions necessary to ensure the health and well-being of each dog. We also provide specialty surgery when needed.

A LOVING TRANSITIONAL HOME

Once medically cleared for adoption, our happy, healthy dogs continue preparation for their forever families. They enjoy a homelike environment in one of our 12x12 climate-controlled cage-free bunk rooms that open to a half-acre, synthetic turf play yard. Dogs are placed in play groups with other dogs of similar temperaments to play, exercise, and receive one-on-one training as needed. Shade trees, sprinklers, toys, and lots of synthetic turf and pools add up to fun, clean, mentally stimulating environments.

When the time comes for dogs to interact with potential owners, they do so in our Meet and Greet Pavilion. In this authentic backyard setting, dogs exhibit their natural tendencies and personalities. The pavilion gives potential owners a chance to introduce dogs they may already have to the dogs they are considering adopting.



First and foremost, your rescue, meaning the people and the grounds of which the rescue runs on are incredible! VETERAN DOG TRAINING PROGRAM

At Big Dog Ranch Rescue, we are extremely grateful for the service of our veterans and active military. We strive to achieve optimal health benefits for veterans with dog-to-human interaction, socialization, and community involvement. We also offer reduced adoption fees and dog boarding to all military members and first responders. That's why we decided to roll out our Veteran Service Dog Training Program. This program allows our veteran dog trainers to prepare our dogs to become service dogs for veterans with PTSD. We are building a 3,400 square-foot training center for this purpose. Our goal is to have 50 dogs graduate this year, and ultimately work our way up to 250 dogs per year.











SENIORS FOR SENIORS PROGRAM

The mission of the Seniors for Seniors Program is to harness the power of love and healing by uniting senior citizens with senior dogs. This program was created to address the one of the most at-risk categories of canine populations - senior dogs who are 7 years or older. This volunteer-supported program consists of two opportunities. The first opportunity is our supported adoption program, which matches senior dogs with senior citizens. Our goal is to place 250 dogs with senior citizens each year. The second opportunity is a visitation program that is designed to promote love and companionship in the most supportive way. We are looking for sponsors and volunteers to help launch this valuable program.

































CHINA DOG RESCUE

Early in 2019 Big Dog Ranch Rescue responded to an urgent plea from a shelter holding dogs saved by Chinese monks from the horrific China dog meat industry. We dispatched a team, led by Lauree Simmons, to recover the animals. They returned from Asia on March 28 with 37 dogs and a new mission to prevent this inhumane treatment and to shed light on the cruelty. As our mission continued we worked through diplomatic channels, publicized the barbaric practice in global news media, and saved over 1000 dogs from slaughter houses and meat markets.

A year from after our first rescue mission and following intense pressure, the Chinese government has now officially reclassified dogs from livestock to companion animals. While this is not a ban on consumption of dog meat we are cautiously optimistic that this signals the beginning of the end of the trade including the horrific Yulin Dog Meat Festival.

We will continue to speak out against this cruel, soulless practice until the terrible tradition ends everywhere. In the meantime we have rescues waiting for their freedom flight to safety. These China dogs have been on standby for months having been fully health checked and vetted and will be safe in the states when global travel resumes. Many of these smaller breeds are unavailable at US shelters and find families readily awaiting their arrival and adoption.



Nations First Animal Anti-Cruelty Bill Becomes New Law Big Dog Ranch Rescue Participates in White House Ceremony

On November 25, 2019 President Donald Trump signed the "Preventing Animal Cruelty and Torture Act" that, for the first time, makes intentional acts of cruelty to animals a federal crime. As a leading nationally recognized advocate for animal rights and strong supporter of the measure, Big Dog Ranch Rescue Founder and President Lauree Simmons was invited to stand next to the President in the Oval office for this important ceremony. "I am so proud to be here and to be part of this event which sends a strong signal that cruelty to animals will not be tolerated in our country. Animals are precious gifts to us and members of our family and I thank President Trump and the members of congress who came together to pass this historic law protecting them." Simmons also encouraged the President to consider speaking with other countries to enact similar legislation with a focus on China where a vicious and inhumane dog meat trade is thriving.

MIRACLE STORY

For over 21 days and 21 nights, little Miracle held onto life from under thousands of pounds of rubble as Hurricane Dorian ravaged his home. While searching for survivors, Big Dog Ranch Rescue's infrared drone system picked up the heat of his broken body from under a collapsed building - and an air conditioning unit. When they finally pulled him out, he was alive - but barely. Having survived purely on rainwater, his body was skeletal. 50% of his body mass had been depleted and he was too broken and weak to move any portion of his body. Miracle is safe and has recovered beautifully and now is living happily ever . after with his lovely family, but his healing process both physically and emotionally was extremely extensive. He had to go through months of physical therapy - all while fighting his severe anemia and positive heartworm status. To this day, Big Dog Ranch Rescue continues to help urgent-care dogs like Miracle. We need YOUR help to continue rescuing, caring for, and treating these dogs. BIG DOG RESCUE VETERINARIAN KATIE BILLMAIER, DVM



Dr. Katie Billmaier graduated from Ross University's College of Veterinary Medicine after earning her undergraduate degree in Biology from the University of Findlay in Findlay, Ohio. Before joining our team, Dr. Billmaier practiced in Northern Virginia and the metro Atlanta area and has also been a provider of in home euthanasia and hospice services. It wasn't until the past two years when she found her calling in rescue and shelter medicine. Her passion is being able to bring her years of experience in practice to help animals and clients in need who may not have received care otherwise. Combined with her love for shelter medicine and the beach, she found her forever home at Big Dog Ranch Rescue as our Medical Director. We look forward to the many years she will bring us in helping treat and save our dogs' lives.

What has been your favorite part of being the veterinarian at BDRR so far?

Putting in long hours and days of care and treatment to nurse an animal back to health and being able to watch them go to their new forever home is what makes every day at the Ranch worth it.

What made you decide to become a veterinarian?

Like many veterinarians, I have loved animals since I was a little girl. My senior year in high school I took part in a mentorship program for a semester shadowing at a local veterinary clinic and it was then that I knew there was nothing else I wanted to do except be a veterinarian. I never had a "Plan B" or backup plan because I knew this was the only career I could see myself in for the rest of my life.

What are the best ways to keep a dog healthy and happy?

Keeping a dog happy and healthy requires several things:

- + Routine veterinary care along with annual exams to ensure your pet remains healthy and protected from parasites and diseases.
- + A well balanced diet that is found in most commercial dry dog foods along with maintaining a healthy weight.
- + Daily exercise based on your pet's needs which may include: walks, swimming, running, fetch among many other activities.
- + Maintaining their coat with monthly baths or grooming services in addition to keeping their nails trimmed. Overgrown nails can cause pain and discomfort to your pet.

How many dogs do you help on average each week? (examples: surgeries, heartworm, treatments, shots, etc.)

At BDRR, we have over 500 dogs on property that we have to oversee and care for. While every week is different, on average we perform approximately 75 spays/neuters, 15 heartworm treatments, 100+ vaccinations and hospitalize and treat at least 1-2 patients for severe illness/disease.

What tips do you have for senior dog owners? How do they need to take care of their dog differently? What age is a dog considered a "senior"?

Senior pets hold a very special place in my heart and can require additional special care as they begin to age. The general rule of thumb in regards to the age your pet becomes a senior is 7 years old. However, this varies tremendously based on the size of your dog. Smaller breeds (i.e. Poodles, Chihuahuas, Shih Tzus) generally live longer than giant breeds (i.e. Great Dane, Mastiff) so they may not begin to show signs of aging until 10-12 years of age whereas a giant breed may show signs at 5-6 years of age.

Once your dog is considered a senior, it is ideal to have physical exams performed every 6 months by your veterinarian as well as annual bloodwork to ensure proper organ function. Our goal as veterinarians is to catch disease processes early while we can still manage and treat them as opposed to waiting until your pet becomes ill.

Your senior dog may require changes in diet, supplements, daily medications based on their aging process; all of which will be tailored to their needs by your veterinarian. Other essentials to consider, as the most common senior ailment is arthritis, are: more bedding, ramps, and floor mats to aid in their mobility and provide additional comfort.
